John's Ladies Guild and at the Mid Eastern Zone Rally volunteered her services as the zone secretary.

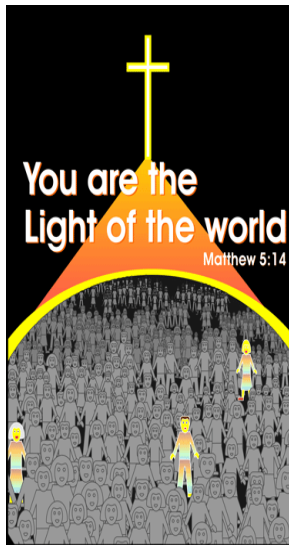
It is Kristi's hope to reach out to the younger women and teens not only in her congregation but, in other societies as well. She would like to let them know how they can be a part of this great organization.

Harriet Fritz, member of Redeemer Lutheran in Springfield MO asks for your help in supporting troops stationed in Afghanistan, Iraq and Kuwait.

Harriet wanted to do more than pray for the military personal listed in her church bulletin so she began to knit caps for soldiers. In 2009, she began “Work for Troops”; a group of church women who knit and crochet wool caps, helmet liners and neck gators for soldiers serving overseas. Her group now receives more requests than they can produce! The troops report that they really appreciate the warm items that come from home.

Harriet's group has shipped more than 1,500 items directly to military units on the ground and to national support groups such as Blue Star Moms who

include them in care packages. Folks at any skill level can help since the pattern is easy enough for beginners. Advanced knitters could complete a cap in just a few hours! In the spirit of Flat Stanley, the Lutheran Women's Missionary League now introduces our much loved President, Janice Wendorf, in the form of “Flat Jan.” In the next few weeks before the LWML Convention in Peoria, “Flat Jan” will be visiting LWML friends around the country. “Flat Jan” is traveling to bring awareness to the Mite Marathon to meet the 2009-2011 mite goal. Please consider sending a special mite donation for each mile Flat Jan has traveled to get to your district, or make a guess at how many total miles she will travel, and send a donation to arrive in March before the end of the biennium to help meet the goal.

Each of you will play an important role in this project that ties into the Mite Marathon ... Race to the Finish. With four “Flat Jan” posters traveling around the country, the goal is to see how many miles “Flat Jan” can travel, and how many mites can be raised, before she arrives to “Play in Peoria” at the LWML Convention, June 23-26, 2011. 3. **Mail “Flat Jan” to her next location by the listed deadline. It is important to keep her travel schedule.** When mailing the “Flat Jan” poster and contents to her next destination it is important that you follow these steps:
  - a. Use the original mailing tube to mail to the next destination.
  - b. Use the mailing label provided to send the materials to the next district president.
  - c. Keep this letter and her itinerary in the tube with the “Flat Jan” poster.

## LWML 2011 PRAYER SERVICE AVAILABLE *FREE*



The LWML Prayer Service for 2010 is now available online at [www.lwml.org](http://www.lwml.org). The service celebrates the theme of the 34th Biennial LWML Convention in Peoria, Illinois, June 23-26, 2011: “Being with Jesus – Living on the Edge!” The convention Bible verse is Acts 4:13b, 20: *And they realized they had been with Jesus. “For we cannot but speak the things which we have seen and heard.”* The convention goal statement is “Empowered by being with Jesus, I courageously speak of Him and live a life transformed by His love.”

With the convention theme, Bible verse, and goal statement in mind, the prayer service presents seven scenarios where women, motivated by the Gospel of Jesus, have the opportunity to share the Good News with others. Time is given for reflection, prayer, and the identification of life situations where participants might be able to witness God’s grace in Jesus Christ. Bible reading and group prayers follow each scenario. The service ends with a mite offering and a pledge for faithful service.

The author, Reverend Carl Gnewuch, served the LWML as Pastoral Counselor from 2005-2009. He is a graduate of Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, currently serving as senior pastor at Our Shepherd Lutheran Church, Birmingham, Michigan. He is married to Cindy for 25 years and they are blessed with children Stephanie, Mark, and Kyle.

The big concern this time of year is the LWML Quarterly subscription. The subscription year starts with the Summer Issue. All changes to the number of issues requested by each society must be sent to National by April 4, 2011. Therefore, it is very important that all our societies decide how many issues are needed for 2011 by March 15. This will allow enough time to compose the list and get it to National before the deadline. Included in this newsletter is a list of how many issues are currently mailed to each society. Grace Schumann worked very hard to try and eliminate the deficit in the Quarterly account. It was reduced but, unfortunately, not eliminated. Any society that may have forgotten to submit their payment for the 2010 subscription is encouraged to do so as soon as possible.

Reverend Buckman will receive \$3,000 for his missionary work in Newark, NJ. Thank you ladies!

Mites are needed to help fulfill the National mite goal. 25% of all the mites that come into the State is sent to National. Time is running out. Keep filling those mite boxes and raising funds with your cake sales, soup sales, etc.

Our 2013 Coalition commitment has been met, but any additional monies received will continue to be sent on to the Coalition. As a host district it is important that we help raise sufficient monies to fund the convention.

And finally – a tribute to Grace Schumann – Grace was so very devoted to her duties as Treasurer. As I work with all the records she kept, I realize how much time and effort she put into her position. She was a lovely lady and is surely missed.

## A note from the VP Life and Servant Resources

The 2010 NJ District Retreat was held on Saturday, November 6<sup>th</sup>. The program Beautiful Feet by Deb Burma, keynote speaker at the upcoming Peoria convention, was chosen because it incorporated our need for bible study, interest, interaction, and cost & time constraints. Prior to planning the retreat, I reviewed the evaluation sheets from the previous event and took into consideration the general consensus that the retreats should end on time and should incorporate group interaction.

Because Crane's Mill was unavailable, the retreat was held at Somerset Hills Lutheran Church in Basking Ridge. Unfortunately, I failed to follow-up on the physical lay-out for the retreat and consequently the interaction portion suffered. The only available PowerPoint venue was the sanctuary which did not lend itself to small group discussion. Additionally, breaks were held at the opposite end of the building which meant more walking, creating difficulty for some ladies and taking additional time. Going forward, I will be more aware of these significant details.

I would be willing to repeat the Beautiful Feet program this spring in south Jersey if there is any interest. I realize traveling for some of our ladies is difficult and I would think it unfair to always make our southern members drive. Perhaps we can alternate sites?

Planning is already underway for the 2011 Fall Retreat. Tentatively, I am looking at another Deb Burma program Treasured. The cost is \$39.99. Details are in this issue. If the Treasured program is designed similarly to Beautiful Feet, I would scale back the program to only three sessions: after Divine Service, after morning break and after lunch, allowing the fourth session after the afternoon break for a servant event or craft project and more opportunity for socializing. I can also scale each session to allow for more singing and still end on time.

Lastly, I recently learned that a co-worker's mother at an LCMS church in MO organized a local group of women who knit and crochet helmet liners for soldiers. He sent me articles from both the LCMS MO District newsletter and the local newspaper. I plan to write a companion article for the NJ District Spring newsletter so that any interested (and talented) ladies from our area who may want to help with this servant project could have the details and instructions. Rev. Buckman has also offered to promote the project through NJ Operation Barnabas, our church body's ministry to Veterans and their loved ones.

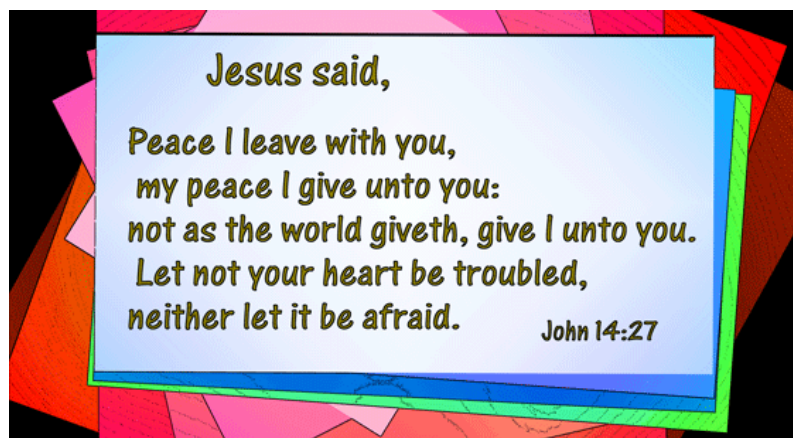
